#### Rehtaeh Parsons

- Sorn December 9th 1995
- Died April 7th 2013
- Raped in November 2011
- Attempted suicide by hanging 17 months after the rape
- Died after 3 days of coma
- 9 6 months after Rehtaeh's death one of the four rapist went to jail for a year accused of child pornography



### Emotion - What is it exactly?

- A strong feeling, such as joy or anger.
- An instinctive or intuitive feeling as distinguished from reasoning or knowledge.
- It comes from Latin "emovere" which means disturb.
- It also can be differentiated from a number of similar constructs within the field of affective neuroscience. Which are feelings, moods and affect.
- Solution Is not the same thing as a mood.

### Reason - What is it exactly?

- It is the power of the mind to think, understand, and form judgments logically. It also tells you what is right, practical, or possible or inversely.
- Strate Its origin is from Greece logos, which in English means "logic".
- It then was translated in Latin as *ratio* which gave us the word reason.



## How does emotion affect our actions?

- It will affect our temperament, personality, disposition and motivation. It can also affect a person's physical well-being, judgments and perception.
- They play a critical role in how individuals behave and react to external stimuli. They can also reduce the rationality in decision making.
- Emotions are the largest chemical balance or imbalance in the mind, so they can quickly cloud judgment and complicate social interactions without the individual being consciously aware that it is happening.

## How does reason affect our actions?

- In mostly all of our actions, emotions come before our judgments.
- The emotions are a much stronger feeling, which will be transmitted quicker than your reasoning.
- Many writers (like Damasio) further argues that rationality requires emotional input in order to function.

## How did it affected her? And why?

- It mostly affected her because of the persistence of the others judging, bullying, ... her, which led her to death.
- This thought was constantly in her mind. Meaning that the Thalamus had the same information for a long period of time.
- She got a tattoo which meant "strength and courage".
- She was receiving messages from people she didn't even know if they could have an intimate relationship.
- One of her friends got stabbed by one of the rapists and got treated for a "non life-threatening injury".
