

To what extent does language shape thought and behavior?

Definition: moral principles that govern a person's behaviour or the conducting of an activity

Ethics

Claim

- Moral principles
- attempts to change its language to reflect its own cultural values and ethics
- influenced by emotions in making moral/ethical decisions



Counterclaim

Reason is not influenced by emotion in making moral/ethical decisions

Example: Case of Ajmal Kasab



•conclusion: moral decisions can be a result of reason accompanied by emotion, but reason may be more predominant

Definition: a branch of study which deals with people or their actions, including the social sciences and the humanities as contrasted with the natural sciences or physical sciences

Human Sciences



Claim

•we think differently based on our language

▶ sapir whorf hypothesis (Linguistic Relativity Hypothesis)

"the proposal that the particular language one speaks influences the way one thinks about reality"



Counterclaim

▶ language reflects thought, not the other way around

4 the spectrum of thought exceeds the one of language

4 thoughts are more so affected by one's culture, not language



Definition: the study of past events, particularly in human affairs

History

Claim

throughout history, language was often used to influence people's thoughts and behaviour

- propaganda
- censorship



Counterclaim

people always had the possibility to not let themselves be affected by politicians and propaganda

- reason and logic

WOK (Ways of Knowing)



To what extent does language shape thought and behavior?

Definition: the method of human communication, either spoken or written, consisting of the use of words in a structured and conventional way

Language

Claim

- Language is the way a person expresses themselves and communicate with others.
 - aim of communication
 - most important way to share and obtain knowledge



Counterclaim

- expressing oneself can be done in many ways
- a. sense perception (other way of gaining information)

Definition: a strong feeling derived from one's circumstances, mood, or relationships with others

Emotion

Claim

Emotion and language directly affect each other

- different formulation lead to more positive/negative perception
 - language is the expression of emotions

The powerful external forces uses emotion as a weapon to influence others behaviour



Counterclaim

language does impact emotions but the effect can be limited

- language can be analyzed critically
- overthinking the intent rather than talking immediately
 - biased views and opinions



Definition: a cause, explanation, or justification for an action or event

Reason



Claim

- Used to justify that language shapes our thoughts
- Usually stated without giving evidence.



Counterclaim

- Biased, people often claim things for their own benefits.

Personal Knowledge

- Reason can often be absurd, or without meaning.
- reason can be misleading and can drive a person to the wrong decision.

Shared Knowledge

scientists have found some evidence that language shapes thought processes

lera boroditsky did an experiment

- asked people to close their eyes and point southeast
- a room of distinguished professors in the U.S pointed in almost every possible direction whereas 5 year old australian aboriginal girls always got it right
- difference lies in the language that you speak
- if you want to learn another language you have to change the way you behave in small but sometimes significant ways
- specifically how you sort things into categories and what you notice
